



2010 13th ANNUAL SKILLS MANITOBA COMPETITION CONTEST SCOPE

CONTEST NAME: Fashion Technology

CONTEST NO: 31

LEVEL: SECONDARY

CONTEST LOCATION: Red River College – Notre Dame Campus

CONTEST START TIME AND DURATION: 5 HOURS & IN-SCHOOL PATTERN WORK

PURPOSE OF CHALLENGE:

To assess the participant's ability in creative design, pattern making, and sewing construction in the field of Women's Apparel Design (skirt).

SKILLS AND KNOWLEDGE TO BE TESTED :

The contest will focus on practical work. Theoretical knowledge is limited to what is necessary to carry out the practical work. Candidates will complete a skirt and its pattern.

- A skirt technical sketch and pattern will be designed by the competitor (fabric swatch & notions available for inspection). The design should be suitable for the target market of a young woman 16-20 years old attending an evening social function and complement a sleeveless top. (picture available)

SKIRT:

- Skirt design will contain a minimum of the following design details: waistband, zipper, pocket;
- The skirt should not be shortened more than 25 cm;
- The waistband must be no wider than 5 cm.;
- Use a template, sketch a technical drawing (front and back view) showing all seams, closures, and details such as top stitch, pockets, etc. of the skirt;
- The competitor will draft the pattern for the skirt using the basic block provided. A working pattern (draft) as well as the final pattern must be submitted. The final pattern will have seam allowances, labels and pattern symbols. This part of the competition will be done at the school level and administered as an exam. The teacher will submit the pattern on the day of the competition.

SEWING CONSTRUCTION:

- Select interfacing and supplies for design from those provided;
- Mark and cut the fabric and interfacing as required for their design;
- Construct the skirt using a sewing machine and domestic serger;
- Underpress, finish, and do final press of the garment.

Industry sewing standards for garment construction to be maintained.

As part of the evaluation, the following aspects will be evaluated:

- The technical drawing;
- The degree of difficulty and skill level of the pattern drafting and sewing construction of the skirt;
- The pattern draft;
- The sewing of the skirt;
- The fit and wearability of the skirt;
- Appropriateness of skirt to the fabric, the top, the occasion and the target market;
- Creativity of design (use of notions and design details);
- The overall skirt appearance and conformity of the design according to the technical sketch.

JUDGING

In the event of a tie, the winner will be determined by:

- a) The highest score in the sewing construction component;
- b) Degree of difficulty in sewing construction.

Judges will be industry representatives.

EQUIPMENT, TOOLS, MATERIALS:

- Each competitor will provide a domestic serger and a domestic portable machine with a regular sewing foot, a zipper foot and a button hole foot;
- Two competitors will share a semi-industrial iron and domestic ironing board (provided);
- Supplies provided: Please contact Brenda Speirs-Fryatt for a list of supplies plus fabric swatches, picture of the top and the basic skirt block.

EQUIPMENT, TOOLS, MATERIALS TO BE SUPPLIED BY COMPETITOR:

Competitors must provide their own tool kit containing, at a minimum, the following items:

- Sewing construction tools;
- Pressing tools;
- Technical drawing tools;
- Domestic sewing machine (button hole capabilities if required);
- 3 or 4 thread domestic serger.

WORKSITE SAFETY RULES/REQUIREMENTS:

Competitors must comply with security and safety regulations at each workstation. Competitors must wear closed toed shoes, no high heels and no slip-on shoes. Long hair must be tied back. Dangling jewelry and long flowing sleeves are not permitted.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS/ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Competitors cannot bring books, written notes, diagrams or directions into the Competition. No paper, scrap fabric, or embellishing materials may be brought on site. Skirt block, pattern paper, and fabric swatch is available from the technical committee. Competitors will have an opportunity to showcase their design in the MMCI Fashion Show on May 6, 2010. Competitors will be asked to sew the top for the fashion show.
